Dear Teacher/Parent

Let's engage in creative learning

Many parents would like to teach English to their children at home, but don't know how to start. It doesn't matter if your own English is not perfect. The most important thing is that you are enthusiastic and that you give your children lots of encouragement and praise. Your child will pick up on your enthusiasm for the language. Don't worry if your child doesn't start speaking English immediately. They will need a certain amount of time to absorb the language. Be patient and they will begin to speak English in their own time.

The topics covered in the tutorial book contain English Language learning for kids. There are activities given for each topic. Teacher / Parent must emphasize on the key concepts to be learnt by the child. Generally the foundation years of a child focuses more on construction of small words along with basic grammatical sense.

Teacher / Parent have to play a vital role in learning by engaging the child in creative learning through various activities. Use of playway method to learn is the best technique to teach kindergarten students. Use of English language wherever possible along with the right pronunciation will help the child getting accustomed to the language.

Key points to remember

- Right pronunciation
- Proper understanding of concept
- · Motivate the child to repeat and imitate
- Explain the meaning of all words you come across and stress on important words so as to develop vocabulary for the child
- Playing games developed around the usage of verbs, gender, singular plural, etc.

The language curriculum integrates easily into many areas of developmental for kindergarten kids. Many learning objectives of English may be presented in activities such as shared reading, dictation writing, language experience activities, routine conversations, quizzes and games. Remember daily practice and regular engagement will definitely accelerate the learning. Regular use of English will develop acceptance and understanding of this language. Give the child an environment so that she/he can practice. Teacher / Parent should also develop reading habit in kids. Motivate them to spend time with books of their relevance. Never get worried or angry on mistakes done by the kids, rather correct and motivate them.

Stay Healthy

A Healthy body carries a healthy mind. Being physically active every day is important for the healthy growth and development of babies, toddlers and preschoolers. For this age group, activity of any intensity should be encouraged, including light activity and more energetic physical activity.

It is recommended that toddlers should be physically active every day for at least 180 minutes (3 hours). The more the better. This should be spread throughout the day, including playing outdoors. The 180 minutes can include light activity such as standing up, moving around, rolling and playing, as well as more energetic activity like skipping, hopping, running and jumping.

Children under 5 should not be inactive for long periods, except when they're asleep. Watching TV, travelling by car, bus or train, or being strapped into a buggy for long periods are not good for a child's health and development. All children under 5 who are overweight can improve their health by meeting the activity guidelines, even if their weight does not change. To achieve and maintain a healthy weight, they may need to do additional activity and make dietary changes.

Every type of active movement is good for the child. Here are few suggested ones:

- · playing with blocks and other objects
- · messy play
- · jumping
- · walking
- · dancing
- swimming
- · playground activities
- · climbing
- · active play, like hide and seek
- · throwing and catching
- · riding a bike
- · outdoor activities
- skipping

Outdoor playing time must be a part of daily routine.


Three letter words

Learning Outcome -

Learning three letter words

Concept / Activity

Take two bowls. Put vowels (a, e, i, o, u) in bowl 1 and consonants in bowl 2. Ask the child to pick a vowel from bowl 1 and two consonants from bowl 2. Consonants are to be picked till a three letter word is formed. The same process can be repeated for other sounds like e, i, o, u. Make sure the child pronounces the words while rearranging the alphabets.




Name the Pictures (3 letter words)
